#### Property Management Update

- $\Rightarrow$  The after hours emergency new phone number for all sites is 931-575-1964.
- ⇒ Pest Control Week July 6-10, 2020, for the exterior.
- ⇒ Remember to pick up items and trash during the mowing season.
- ⇒ All work orders must come through; the central office residents should not approach the maintenance staff for this request.
- ⇒ All units with indoor furniture on porches will be charged a fee.
- ⇒ Please update all new phone numbers with the Central office.
- $\Rightarrow$  Pet owners make sure to report pet information to the central office. Owners must clean all pet waste after walking and pets must be leashed while outside.
- ⇒ There are no designated parking spaces for CHA residents; it's on a first-come basis.
- ⇒ All vehicles parked in disabled parking must have a disabled sign visible. Vehicles will be tagged and towed.
- ⇒ All Housekeeping inspections will resume in July. Residents with recertification dates in March, April and May will receive a letter for housekeeping inspections date.
